Small Grants throughout the year

Small Grants will be invited and awarded quarterly, as shown below (please note that dates may be changed prior to publication).

Based on the budget agreed for 2024/25, Ashington Town Council has £10,000 available for this purpose. Community groups and organisations will be invited to apply for small grants of less than £500. You can only apply for a small grant of £500 once in the financial year.

Funding Criteria that must be met

Small grants are for voluntary, non-profit making organisations who provide facilities, activities, and services principally for residents served by Ashington Town Council.

Typically, these organisations include sports, play and art clubs, community associations, youth organisations, organisations that assist disadvantaged/vulnerable groups and charitable trusts, and in particular those who support underrepresented or marginalised groups.

To be eligible to apply for funding from Ashington Town Council, you must be able to provide the following:

- ✓ A constitution or governing document, or written aims and objectives.
- ✓ Up-to-date financial information, including latest accounts and bank statement.
- ✓ A set a basic core policies (please contact the Council to discuss this)
- ✓ In addition, if you are applying for a **Small Grant** from Ashington Town Council, you must be prepared to explain the purpose of any reserves held.

We will support any group to achieve the required policies, in accordance with our work to promote Equality and Diversity, and in keeping with the Public Sector Equality Duty 2022.

Organisations that will not be funded

- X Individuals.
- X Business organisations whose aim is profit.
- X National charities (unless specific direct services are provided within the local area).
- X Schools.
- X Religious establishments.
- X Other organisations operating from outside Ashington (unless specific direct services are provided within the local area, or these organisations contribute to the wellbeing of the Town and its residents)
