Ashington Town Council - Priorities Identified in 2023-24

It was AGREED to respond to Northumberland County Council Highways with the following three priority issues, for considered inclusion in the Local Transport Plan Programme 2023-24:

- Pedestrian Safety is an issue on Newbiggin Road, from The Elephant and over the roundabout adjacent to the churchyard. Presently, a worn-down zebra crossing is used unsafely due to the speed and volume of traffic. Safety could be improved if the zebra crossing was replaced with a pelican or puffin crossing. This supports a priority issue identified by County Cllr Mark Purvis.
- 2. The surface condition of Burnside Road is unacceptable and requires resurfacing. This supports a priority a priority issue identified by County Cllr Jim Lang.
- 3. Vehicles frequently travelling at excessive speeds on North Seaton Road, in particular from Green Lane junction towards the Town Centre (Station Road). This supports a priority issue identified by County Cllr Caroline Ball.
